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HICKORY CHAIR REVEALS THE DAVID PHOENIX COLLECTION IN CELEBRATION OF ITS 115TH ANNIVERSARY

APRIL 24, 2026, HIGH POINT, NORTH CAROLINA – At the International Home Furnishings Market this spring, David Phoenix presents his fourth furniture collection for Hickory Chair, continuing a design partnership introduced in 2017. With a decade of collaboration, Phoenix has developed a body of work defined by restraint, longevity, and a deep respect for how people live with furniture over time.



In conceiving this new collection, Phoenix’s goal was to create furniture that feels established from the onset, pieces defined by proportion, comfort, and material integrity rather than fleeting trends. Each design was approached with the intention of working easily within existing interiors while offering a clear point of view.

“I’m inspired by the idea that personal design style should feel intentional, composed, and enduring.”

From this foundation, the collection brings together three defining design influences: European antiques, Mid-Century modernism, and contemporary Italian design. These references inform scale and comfort, shaping furniture that feels grounded and familiar while remaining relevant today.

The new collection extends Phoenix’s earlier work with Hickory Chair, introducing a considered range of seating, case goods, and accents. Each piece stands confidently on its own while remaining compatible with prior Phoenix designs, antiques, and modern furnishings. “This collection reflects how I live and design today. The collection feels more edited, more focused, and rooted in comfort,” says Phoenix.

“Furniture should settle into a room, not announce itself, as the best pieces feel familiar from the start.”

Phoenix’s new designs promote an elevated sense of permanence and familiarity. Materials and finishes are honest and expressive, chosen for their beauty, quality, and integrity. Wood grain, metalwork, and stone surfaces remain visible and tactile, resulting in an elevated sense of luxury rooted in substance rather than ornament. Standard Hickory Chair finishes, paint options, and customizable hardware encourage personalization. Pieces that float within a space offer architectural presence without overpowering a room. Livability and functionality are not just add-ons to Phoenix. In this recent collection, they are the guiding principles.

As with all of Phoenix’s work for Hickory Chair, physical comfort remains central. Proportions are lower, deeper, and broader. A standout is the El Dorado Sofa, which features sculptural upholstered forms informed by Mid-Century design. Deep horizontal panels envelop the curvaceous frame and allow for contrasting fabrics. Floating on a wooden plinth base, the El Dorado maintains its visual lightness, while two-cushion

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seats are paired with a tailored, tight back to continue the sleek, sumptuous elegance. The El Dorado is also available as a stationary and swivel lounge chair.

Construction and detailing reflect the same disciplined approach seen throughout the collection, supported by Hickory Chair’s long-standing commitment to quality and craftsmanship. From scale and proportion to finish application, each piece reflects standards refined over more than a century of furniture-making.

Another collection highlight is the striking Grand Trine occasional pieces, a trio of individually sized, nesting cocktail tables that can cluster together to form a sculptural centerpiece or stand on their own as distinctive cocktail tables. Influenced by contemporary Italian sculpture, each table pairs an Oak pedestal base with a striking, Straw Marquetry top. Their stunning radial pattern is softened by asymmetrical, multi-sided organic forms and gently rounded edges, creating a natural ease and unlimited flexibility in a space.

“The latest additions reflect the strength of our long-standing collaboration with David Phoenix,” says Megan Barrett, Vice President of Merchandising for Hickory Chair. “Each new introduction builds on what came before, offering designers and dealers products that feel relevant, flexible, and timeless within the Hickory Chair assortment.”

Phoenix’s newest collection brings clarity through form, proportion, and material, drawing from historical and modern influences. The result is furniture that is beautiful and enduring.
